2021 scholars meet with dignitaries







## Russ appears on East Midlands Today!



Our secretary and treasurer, Russ Blenkinsop, recently <u>appeared on East Midlands Today</u> to talk about taking action to limit climate change and avoid local disasters.

The news item was prompted by the publication of a report by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), showing that without immediate global action the average temperature of the planet will rise above the internationally agreed threshold of 1.5 degrees celsius.

Whilst the impact of climate change is often thought to be happening "elsewhere", Russ and his neighbours in Lowdham have experienced increasingly frequent and severe flooding in recent years.

East Midlands Today's environment correspondent, Sally Bowman, spoke with Russ in his capacity as secretary of Lowdham Flood Action Group to find out

more about the regional experience of climate change.
